About the role

- To be knowledgeable of all residents'/tenants' needs and understand how to deal with all eventualities
- To assist when residents are getting up and maintain the morning routine with day staff
- To write a brief report regarding any issues at night
- Undertake domestic duties, such as laundry and ironing, food preparation, cleaning kitchens, bathrooms, toilets and communal areas as required.

There is a requirement for flexible working including weekends.
